A. Legislative Action Days Update Update from Nathan Corder.

- NAGPS send students twice a year to congress to lobby for graduate students (Legislative Action Days)
- Healthcare, domestic renewal of F1 visas, open access, unionization (private institutions are now allowed to unionize)
- Free Access to Science and Technology Research in Senate for vote (open access research).
- Rep. Holding, Jones, Tillis, Burr (others).
- Spent most of time talking about healthcare issue.
- Met with Dept of labor -> possible let students roll F1 into extension if they start a small business (want 2-5 years). Business has to make a tangible product.
- **Question:** Legislative Action Days Open to any students at NC State? (yes! You do not have to be a citizen)
- **Question:** More information on F1 rollover visa. (MIT had meeting with Dept. of Labor. They forwarded today information on a webinar Oct 19. Nathan will forward information on this to exec board)
- Nathan notes that the spring session will be more important because it is not a "lame duck" session.
- John M- we do not go to NAGPS conferences.
- Question of students can go to lobby for personal opinions such as concealed carry. (Nathan – yes (I believe – verify?))

B. Health Care Changes

- In Feb IRS issued that graduate students should be considered as employee. Now subsidizing health care is no longer allowed. One year of leniency was given. University can be fined up to \$100 per day per student for not complying.
- Missouri students unionized. Carnegie Mellon increased stipends and students were not eligible for medicare/Medicaid because income was too high.
- One option is that we would be put on the general student health insurance and would have to pay for it (perhaps stipends would be increased). It's an option the university is looking into, but are unsure if it will still violate conditions.
- Letter going around to get one more year of leniency QUESTIONS

Does this affect us going to the health center?

It should not affect ability to use health center. May affect physical therapy, radiology. Student health fees cover majority of general visits unless you need to see a specialist.

GSSP RA/TA plan?

This is the type of health insurance which will be affected predominantly. May also affect fellowships such as NSF.

Why does this affect us if we're still enrolled as students?

(2013) IRS declared graduate students are employees, therefore, we do not qualify for subsidized health insurance.		
We can actually unionize (Tyler says), but we can't go on strike or negotiate contracts		
Dean Grasso is aware that this is causing anxiety amongst grad students. Will want to bring in grad students for feedback further along in negotiations with Blue Cross & Blue Shield.
