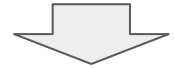

Parli-Pro Question/Discussion Structure:

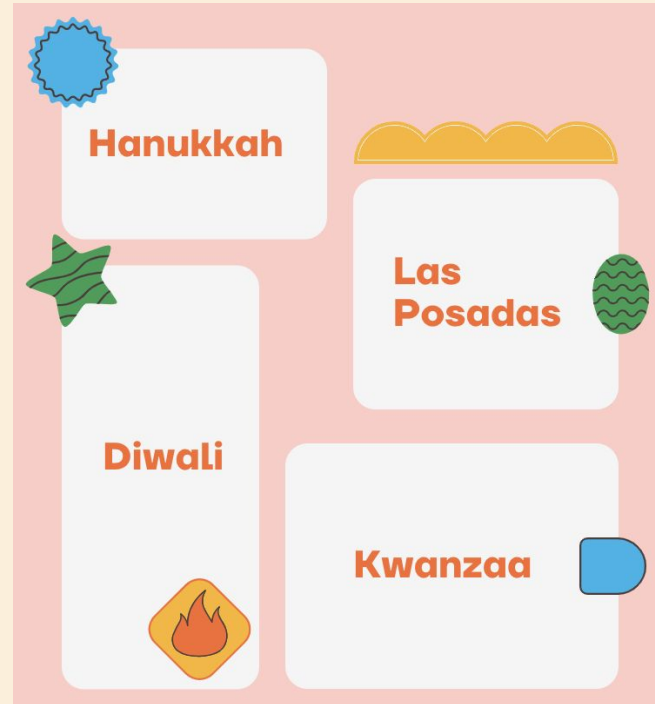
INCLUSIVITY FOR PROGRAMMING

- Using gender neutral language and introducing yourself with your preferred pronouns

Part VIII: The IRC By-Laws

Chapter 1: Ratification

The IRC By-Laws shall go into effect immediately following approval by a two-thirds majority of the IRC General Assembly members present at the meeting at which the ratification vote is held.

Chapter 2: Amendments

Any amendments to the IRC By-Laws must be approved by a simple majority of the IRC General Assembly members present.

#1 Current: IRC Eboard Compensation Amounts

Chapter 3: IRC Executive Board Compensation

Article I: Annual Compensation

The IRC Executive Board shall be compensated (annually) as follows:

President	\$2,741.00
Vice-President for Community Affairs	\$1,735.00
Vice-President of Programming	\$1,735.00
Vice-President of Media and Marketing	\$1,735.00
Vice-President of Business and Finance	\$1,735.00
Vice-President of National Communications Coordination	\$1,735.00

The Vice Presidents of the IRC Executive Board will receive a stipend equal to the base amount for Resident Advisers for the current school year. Any increases in the base stipend amount for Resident Advisers will correlate to a stipend increase for the IRC Executive Board. The IRC President will receive a stipend equal to 58% percent higher than the Vice-President Stipend.

Proposed Change: IRC Eboard Compensation Amounts

Chapter 3: IRC Executive Board Compensation

Article I: Annual Compensation

The IRC Executive Board shall be compensated (annually) as follows:

President	\$2,741.00	\$2,500.00
Vice-President for Community Affairs	\$1,735.00	\$2,000.00
Vice-President of Programming	\$1,735.00	\$2,000.00
Vice-President of Media and Marketing	\$1,735.00	\$2,000.00
Vice-President of Business and Finance	\$1,735.00	\$2,000.00
Vice-President of National Communications Coordination	\$1,735.00	\$2,000.00

The Vice Presidents of the IRC Executive Board will receive a stipend equal to the base amount for Resident Advisers for the current school year. Any increases in the base stipend amount for Resident Advisers will correlate to a stipend increase for the IRC Executive Board. The IRC President will receive a stipend equal to ~~58%~~ **20%** percent higher than the Vice-President Stipend.

Reasoning Behind Changes:

President: ~~\$2,741.00~~ **\$2,500.00**

Vice Presidents: ~~\$1,735.00~~ **\$2,000.00**

The IRC President will receive a stipend equal to ~~58%~~ **20%** percent higher than the Vice-President Stipend.

Background:

Section 3: Duties of the Executive Board

Part One: Duties of the President The President shall:

A. see that all IRC elections and appointments are conducted properly in accordance with the Constitution and the By-Laws thereto;

D. Appoint any vacant IRC elected position and/or IRC Liaison when applicable or delegate all duties of the vacant position

It is my duty as president to call upon appointments for vacant positions.

Reasoning Behind Changes:

Nominees for the IRC Executive Board shall ~~be in at least their second consecutive semester on campus.~~ **have lived in university housing for at least one semester this academic year and remain on campus for the duration of the academic year.**

What does this mean:

- **Allowing first year students to serve on the IRC Exec Board that the president appointed and the GA votes in**

GOAL: Suspension for the 21-22 academic year only. Return to normal for 22-23 elections

- First year students and second year students on campus have almost the same amount of experience living on campus due to the pandemic
- Ensure the longevity of IRC and looking to future power transitions
- Build a strong team for the spring,

Additional amendments if voted in:

Section 3: Duties of the Executive Board The Executive Board shall:

C. meet at least bi-weekly with the IRC Advisor and IRC President. **If they are a first year student, they will meet weekly with the IRC President;**

- Increased guidance and support into positions to make up for less time in higher education

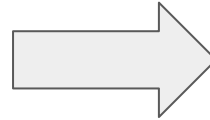
