An NC State associate professor made statements in his Physics 211 lecture that disvalued the female-identified students in his class. After the professor was made aware that his comments were taken offense to, he proceeded to show ignorance towards his actions. His words perpetuate the stigma of female-identified students in STEM fields and exemplify that we as an institution have an alarming space for improvement regarding marginalized individuals in spaces of higher education. Language like his historically supports barriers between female-identified students and education.
